<u>Update from Church Council and Covid-19 Working Group</u>

Over the past year, we have been delighted to re-gather at in-person events while simultaneously maintaining zoom access for most of our activities. We are grateful for the respectful care offered over the past years and grateful for the community's ongoing commitment to the safety and well-being of all in our community and beyond.

Beginning after Easter Sunday 2023, First United is adopting practices which recognize that Covid-19 remains a serious illness, while moving beyond previous pandemic protocols.

These practices include:

- Following the recommendation of Public Health in support of keeping our vaccinations for Covid-19 and the flu up to date. Covid-19 vaccines are effective, and the staff of First United keep their vaccinations updated.
- Continuing self-screening. We ask that you not attend in-person gatherings
 when feeling unwell or experiencing Covid-19 symptoms. This practice is also
 requested when one has been exposed to someone who has tested positive for
 Covid. We continue to maintain participation via Zoom.
- Encouraging masking. Public Health continues to recommend the wearing of masks indoors. Masking at in-person events, while voluntary, is encouraged. We mask to reduce risk to ourselves and we respect all those who mask and maintain respectful distancing.
- Maintaining ventilation of spaces for in-person gatherings.
- Adapting our liturgical practices. The Church Council and Sunday
 Leadership are prayerfully discerning and updating our liturgical practices, with a
 view of maintaining both the integrity and the safety of these practices.

We will continue to have Zoom services and meet in-person.
